### **Old State House Museum**

The Old State House, built in 1713 on the site of the first Town House, is the oldest surviving public building in Boston. The building served as a meeting place for the exchange of economic and local news and was said to be the centre of politics in the colonies.


### **Boston Tea Party Ships & Museum**

The Boston Tea Party was "the single most important event leading up to the American Revolution." It is dedicated to telling the story of that fateful night of December 16, 1773.
